As much as there is freedom of expression, we must know where to draw the line not to inflict injury on fellow human because of our speech.

Hate speech is an alarm bell - the louder it rings, the greater the threat of genocide. It precedes and promotes violence."

ANTÓNIO GUTERRES, United Nations Secretary-General, 2023

As much as there is freedom of speech, we must be able to draw the line what you consider free expression and abusive words. Some hide under freedom of expression to practice hate speech. Why hate speech: People practice hate speech because of Fear, insecurity, mistrust, and above all inferiority complex. They think when they adopt that method it brings them at par with those they feel are superior to them which they get wrong. Lack of control of anger can also be a causative agent. It is good to avoid talking when angry. Some people believe blackmailing or the practice of Hate Speech is a way of expressing their anger to get back at somebody who has offended them.

SOCIAL MEDIA EFFECT

Hate speech is spreading faster and further than ever before as a result of social media user growth and the rise of populism. Both online and offline, hate speech targets people and groups based on who they are. It has the potential to ignite and fuel violence, spawn violent extremist ideologies, including atrocity crimes and genocide. It discriminates and infringes on individual and collective human rights, and undermines social cohesion.

We need to start from the home front to curtail the menace associated with Hate Speech. Discourage gossip and side talk, lies, favoritism among siblings. Avoid scheming, whims and caprices.

Education can play a central role in countering hateful narratives and the emergence of group-targeted violence. Educational responses to hate speech and all forms of hateful communication include:

- Training teachers and learners on the values and practices related to being respectful global and digital citizens;
- Adopting pedagogical and whole-school approaches to strengthening social and emotional learning;
- Revising and reviewing curricula and educational materials to make them culturally responsive and to include content that identifies hate speech and promotes the right to freedom of expression;

This policy guide developed by UNESCO and the United Nations' Office on Genocide Prevention and the Responsibility to Protect explores these educational responses and provides guidance and recommendations to policy-makers on how to strengthen education

Engage - how to deal with hate speech?

Hate speech occurs in all societies, whether offline or online. It can sometimes be hard to assess when a comment is meant as hate speech – especially when expressed in the virtual world. It can also feel overwhelming to try to deal with obviously hateful content.

However, there are many ways you can take a stand, even if you are not personally the victim of hate speech. And you can make a difference. The following tips may be helpful.

UNITED NATIONS SUGGESTED SOLUTIONS (COPIED)

Pause

Refrain from making any hateful comments yourself and/or relaying such content. Whether online or offline, we should all act responsibly to stop the spread of hate and misinformation. Check out the United Nations #Pledge to Pause campaign to find out why it's important to take a moment to pause before you share content online. Learn how to do this responsibly – whether you're forwarding a message, retweeting a story or watching a video in your feed.

Fact-check

In the digital world, it's common to come across misinformation and harmful content, but it's relatively easy to verify content you find is reliable. To detect false and biased information, including hate speech propaganda, be sure to check the content's origin with the help of search engines, fact-checking tools and other reliable sources. You can also download images and run them through image search tools to find out where they appeared first.

React

Whenever possible, do not remain silent, even when it is others who are targeted. Speak up calmly but firmly against hate speech and call it out to make clear that you do not agree with the content of the statement. When relevant, refute misinformation with facts, providing reliable sources to back up your argument.

Challenge

One way to tackle hate speech is to spread your own counter-speech to make sure hate is not the dominant narrative. You can undermine hateful content with positive messages that spread tolerance, equality and truth in defense of those being targeted by hate.

Support

Taking a public stand for, and extending solidarity to, people who are the targets of hate speech demonstrates that rejecting hate is the responsibility of every individual.

Report

Most online platforms and communities have rules to keep user discussions respectful and will let you easily report hate messages to administrators or moderators. Read social media platform guidelines and tips to protect users from harassment and hate speech. For more serious cases – which may constitute incitement to violence, harassment and/or threats prohibited by law – notify organizations fighting hate speech and/or file a complaint with police (or the public prosecutor). Some countries have online tools to make reporting hate speech easier.

Educate

You can help raise awareness of hate speech -- online or offline – simply by engaging with your family and friends in conversations about how hateful content can harm societies. Advocate for responsible behavior and share public campaigns and educational resources.

Commit

Consider joining an NGO or other civil society initiative that works to address the issue of hate speech in your community.

Shun Hate Speech. Do not out of superiority of argument, you engage in hate speech, you engage in slander, backbiting, and any manner of expression that indicate hatred and prejudice. Let us instead promote and express love in the society to have a conducive one. N' Etsako yalo


